

2 Corinthians 5:15 – “and for all he died, that those living, no more to themselves may live, but to him who died for them, and was raised again.” (Youngs Literal Translation)

- NASB – “And He died for all, so that they who live might no longer live for themselves, but for Him who died and rose again on their behalf.”
- NIV – “And he died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for him who died for them and was raised again. “
- LB – “He died for all so that all who live-having received eternal life from him-might live no longer for themselves, to please themselves, but to spend their lives pleasing Christ who died and rose again for them.”

Matthew 27:11 – “And Jesus stood before the governor, and the governor did question him, saying, `Art thou the king of the Jews!' And Jesus said to him, `Thou sayest.” (Youngs Literal Translation)

- NASB – “Now Jesus stood before the governor, and the governor questioned Him, saying, "Are You the King of the Jews?" And Jesus said to him, "It is as you say."”
- NIV – “Meanwhile Jesus stood before the governor, and the governor asked him, "Are you the king of the Jews?" "Yes, it is as you say," Jesus replied.
- LB – “Now Jesus was standing before Pilate, the Roman governor. "Are you the Jews' Messiah?" the governor asked him.”

Matthew 25:14-15 – “For--as a man going abroad did call his own servants, and did deliver to them his substance, and to one he gave five talents, and to another two, and to another one, to each according to his several ability, went abroad immediately.” (Youngs Literal Translation)

- NASB – “For it is just like a man about to go on a journey, who called his own slaves and entrusted his possessions to them. To one he gave five talents, to another, two, and to another, one, each according to his own ability; and he went on his journey.”
- NIV – “Again, it will be like a man going on a journey, who called his servants and entrusted his property to them. To one he gave five talents of money, to another two talents, and to another one talent, each according to his ability. Then he went on his journey.”
- LB – “Again, the Kingdom of Heaven can be illustrated by the story of a man going into another country, who called together his servants and loaned them money to invest for him while he was gone. He gave \$5,000 to one, \$2,000 to another, and \$1,000 to the last-dividing it in proportion to their abilities-and then left on his trip.”
